Senior Services Organization Elects President of Board

LiveOn NY, formerly known as The Council of Senior Centers and Services, recently announced that David V. Pomeranz, chief operating officer of the Hebrew Home at Riverdale, has been elected president of its Board of Directors.

As board president, he will concentrate his efforts on board development and reorganization, fundraising, growing membership and the statewide expansion of the newly rebranded LiveOn NY.

Pomeranz has served on the CSCS/LiveOn NY board since 2009, most recently as vice president.

Pomeranz has three decades of experience in improving the lives of older adults in New York. As the COO of Hebrew Home, he spearheaded the launch of the Managed Long Term Care offering, ElderServe Health, designed to help New Yorkers live independently at home.

He was a driving force behind the conversion of Hudson House to a low-income apartment building for older New Yorkers, and his passion for technology led to the creation of an app, “Balance,” to help Alzheimer’s caregivers better manage the complexities of care.

Pomeranz has been recognized for his contributions to the elderly, receiving the 2000 Professional of the Year award by New York Leading Age and the 2009 Humanitarian of the Year award from the Burden Center.

He replaces Joan L. Ryan, who now serves as board chairperson.
